BRPC Awarded Broadband Development Grant

The Department of Economic Development announced on March 31 that Boonslick Regional Planning Commission (BRPC) is the recipient of a Digital Demonstration Project grant. The program will support digital opportunities in the region and will serve as a demonstration

project to collect data for the state to develop a comprehensive plan for future digital opportunity activities across the state. BRPC will be conducting education activities to help Missourians overcome barriers to fully utilize technology including internet usage, telehealth, job searches and more.

BRPC will be working with community partners to reach aging individuals, veterans, individuals with disabilities and rural residents to teach and improve digital navigation skills. This project will be starting in April and continue through August.

In addition, BRPC will be receiving a grant from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) for Affordable Connectivity Program Outreach. The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a national program to help bridge the broadband affordability gap. BRPC will be helping create awareness of the program as well as assisting individuals in determining if they are eligible for the ACP program and providing assistance in enrollment for those households that qualify. Activities associated with the Affordable Connectivity Program will begin later this spring and continue through early 2025.

Also, be on the lookout for more information about a community input meeting on broadband issues for the Boonslick Region, tentatively scheduled for May 22. The Missouri Office of Broadband Development will be conducting these meetings across the state this spring. Details will be available on our website, www.boonslick.org.

Opening its doors on Earth Day 2010, the East Central Missouri Recycling Center was a collaborative effort of the four counties in the Region I Solid Waste Management District to provide recycling opportunities for area residents. The facility serves Franklin, Lincoln, Montgomery, and Warren counties and is open year round. A wide variety of items are accepted, including those not typically accepted

Federal Home Loan Bank Affordable Housing Program



The Affordable Housing Program (AHP) provides grant funding to support the purchase, construction, or rehabilitation of affordable housing in local communities to improve the quality of life, safety, opportunity, and prosperity of those benefitting from

the funded project. This competitive program encourages partnerships between member financial institutions and housing providers in order to secure funding for homeownership or rental housing units. Grant funds are available to nonprofits, governments, housing authorities, and other gualifying organizations. Funds should benefit low-income families, seniors, persons with disabilities, or homeless and at-risk youth.

BRPC staff are available to assist in working with organizations to complete the development of a project, completing the application, and serving as the project administrator during the implementation of an approved project.
